

Pathways News from Eureka Springs United Methodist Church

8th of December 2024

We light the Candle of Faith this morning. Our Advent journey is halfway over. The season is a busy one with Thanksgiving coming so late this year. Please remember next Sunday is the Chancel Choir's Cantata. John and the choir have been practicing for a few months now for this special Sunday of music. On December 20th at 6 PM we will host our Blue Christmas: Service of the Longest Night. This is a Christmas Eve service for those who might not be feeling the joy of the holidays. Christmas is not always the most wonderful time of the year as we battle grief and pain. For some, it is the loss of a spouse or child, for others it is mourning a parent or sibling or friend. Still



others are just struggling economically or emotionally. The Jubilee Ringers will be playing along with other gifted and talented musicians as we pause to be a bit more reflective in our Christmas observance. On December 24th at 5:30 PM we will open our doors to the community as we celebrate the birth of Christ thru carols, candlelight, and communion. Despite all of this busyness, our missions and ministries continue. The mobile pantry will be giving out Christmas boxes, and our shower ministry still sees a steady stream of people looking to get clean and wash their clothes. Our blessing closet has coats, hats, gloves, and other things that are needed to help the homeless get thru these cold winter nights. We have kicked off our campaign to buy a generator. The storms this past summer brought an awareness that our community lacks a disaster relief shelter — a place where people may come when they have lost power or shelter. With a generator, we can keep the church cool or warm (depending on the season), keep the lights on, and provide those hit by disaster with a place to come to. A generator, complete with installation, will cost us about \$25,000, and it would be nice to have this in place before prices increase. December is the time of year when many of us are looking to give a little extra, and also when you retirees are looking to avoid capital gains taxes. We have ways where you can donate stock and avoid these taxes. Our mission is to serve the most vulnerable, and to be a church that is more than the four walls. Installing a generator is just the next phase of this mission, so as charities and colleges beg you for

donations please remember this mission of the church. Thank you so much for all you do to make us who we are!

Our church showers are open to men and women so they can freshen up, do a load of laundry, and be ready for a job interview, medical appointment, or just a chance to be clean. Showers are available **Monday and Wednesdays**, **9 AM till 1:00 PM**.

Pantry Current needs: Electric fry pan, toasters, men & women sturdy sneakers/hiking boots, waterproof spray for outdoor gear, blankets, men's work & winter gloves, thermal & regular underwear (men's & women's), men/women's jackets, hoodies, hats (Med, LG, XL). Donations can be dropped off at the church. We are looking for volunteers to come in once a week to give the showers a deep cleaning.

Berryville UMC, 400 Eureka Ave, Berryville, 870.423.2505, is opening their doors on very cold nights for those needing a warm place to sleep. Check-in is between 4:30-7:30pm. They also have showers and laundry services available nearby. We can provide transportation with a 24+ hour notice.

The Youth Group is open to all teens aged 13-17. Transportation is available (Call 479.244.8987) This ministry will facilitate important connections with our youth, while providing a safe place to meet each week. We are starting a new bible study that will serve as an introduction to the Old Testament. These are lectures by Dr Amy Jill Levine, a noted biblical scholar. This will take up about thirty minutes, and then we'll spend 30 minutes discussing the topics she raises. We meet **Wednesdays in the church library at 6 PM.** All are welcome to attend.

The book recommendation for this week is located in the religion area of the library. Where God Was Born: A Journey by Land to the Roots of Religion (200.956/Fei) by Bruce Feiler uncovers details about the common roots of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam and affirms the importance of the Bible today.

Our Shower/Laundry Ministry is a much needed mission in this community and has experienced exponential growth over the last couple years. Going forward we are implementing Mondays & Wednesdays as shower/laundry days from 9-1PM. We are **looking for volunteers in the office to help facilitate this ministry.** Training is provided.
