Current needs: Study Bibles, Toilet Paper, Nutrient Dense canned goods: Chili, Ravoli, canned tuna, chicken, pasta & sauce, soups, breakfast bars, oatmeal, Men & women's sneakers/hiking boots, Lg & med. size thermal underwear (men & women), hoodies, 1.5 QT crock pots, toasters, hot plates. Please make sure clothing donations are clean. Donations can be dropped off at the church. **Thank you to all our faithful donors and supporters of this ministry!**

Because of the generosity of our donors, we have excess winter clothing, coats and shoes to **give away Wednesday**, **February 12 Mobile Food Pantry**, starting at 8:30 AM. Typically, we run out of food (& clothing) within the first hour. To make this a success, **we need at least two volunteers** to manage the clothing station while minimizing chaos. Yes, it will be very cold, but imagine not having adequate winter wear to keep warm. WE NEED YOUR HELP! Let Blake or the office know you can volunteer, or just simply show up at **8:15 am Wednesday**, **February 12** by the church entrance. Thank you!

The Youth Group is open to all teens aged 13-17.
