This is only a four hour commitment on Mondays and Wednesdays, you can choose weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly service, church staff will be present. Please let us know if you are available! This ministry serves those who are in crisis who may need to clean up in order to look for a job or because they have lost utilities, or are currently living in their cars. Next Sunday is ALL SAINTS SUNDAY. This is the Sunday we set aside to remember, celebrate, and honor those who have passed triumphantly thru death to life everlasting during the past year. If you have a loved one you wish to remember please send me their name, birthdate and



death date along with a picture. We will read out their names and toll the bell as our act of remembrance. Then, there will be a time during Communion when we all can come and place votive candles along the chancel rail to remember all those we have lost. This is a very sacred service, a chance to acknowledge our collective grief, and hold one another in love. Early voting is happening now, and <u>Election Day</u> is November 5th. I know it is popular to comment that our votes don't matter. This is unfortunate. Voting is your right and privilege and the price of that gift was paid in blood by millions who fought to make this land free. Democracy is on the ropes in many places around the world — strangled by apathy and lack of participation. When you vote you are proclaiming your vision for the future. Arkansas has one of the lowest voter participation

The book recommendation for this week is an autobiography—The Boy Who Carried Bricks (B/Car) by Alton Carter. Abandoned by his father and neglected by his mother, Carter describes a childhood of violence, hunger, and isolation. After living in a series of foster homes and a boys ranch the author longed for a "normal life." He was the first in his family to graduate from high school and college. After working in law enforcement for several years he is now the director of youth ministries for First United Methodist Church in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

We are starting a new bible study that will serve as an introduction to the Old Testament. These are lectures by Dr Amy Jill Levine, a noted biblical scholar. This will take up about thirty minutes, and then we'll spend 30 minutes discussing the topics she raises. We meet **Wednesdavs in the church library at 6 PM.** All are welcome to attend.
