


Methodism 101: Polity. The General Conference of the World-wide United Methodist Church is meeting over the next several weeks to renew and change our denomination. The United Methodist Church is governed much like the United States Federal government. There are three branches: the Judicial, the Executive, and the Legislative. Our Council of Bishops is the executive branch, elected by a Jurisdictional Conferences composed of an equal number of lay and clergy delegates elected by our Annual Conference. The General Conference is our legislative branch. It meets once every four years to make changes to our "Discipline" - our governing rules. The Judicial Committee makes rulings over whether or not the decisions

of the other two are "constitutional". In 2019 the Council of Bishops called a special General Conference to once and for all solve the issue of human sexuality. Plans were in place for a great compromise that would remove all language concerning human sexuality from our Discipline and allow individual churches and Annual Conferences to decide what was best for their mission fields. Tragically, the 2019 Conference was hijacked by conservative elements that managed to push thru even harsher language and punishments around human sexuality. The church at large immediately revolted and elected a slate of progressive delegates for the 2020 General Conference, which due to the Pandemic, was postponed until this year. With the leaving of most conservative churches (about 25% of our total) we are hopeful that long-needed reforms may finally be enacted. In 1968, at the uniting of the Methodist Church and the United Brethren, human



sexuality was placed in our Discipline and was immediately controversial. The man who inserted the language later came to regret his actions, but for a generation now, we have argued and debated and we have hurt so very many people. This year we hope to approve a new "Social Principles" that simply defines marriage as between two people. We hope to turn America into a Regional Conference like the rest of the world so that we can write our own Book of Discipline that eliminates the anti-homosexual language and finally acknowledges all people as children of God. We are sure to be in the news quite a bit these next few weeks, and there are many bad actors who still seek to destroy the denomination. Be careful of these news reports and rumors that will surround the work of these delegates. Pray for them as they come together to remake the church to be more inclusive, affirming, and loving. Pray also for those who persecute us; it must be a shallow faith that seeks to do harm, and their lack of love should be pitied.
