


Today is All Saints' Sunday. It is the moment in the Christian year when we honor and remember all those who have passed triumphantly thru death to life-everlasting. In the early days of the church all people were called saints, and so a special day was set aside to honor their memory. The color is white, symbolizing the triumph of faith. During our service we will read out the names of those loved ones who have died during the past year; a bell will then toll, and a candle lit and placed in the baptismal font. According to the book of Common Prayer, this liturgy is an Easter one, for it finds all of its meaning in the Resurrection of Christ; because Christ was raised from the dead we know that we too shall be raised. This service is therefore characterized by joy, "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." This joy does not make our grief unChristian; the very love we hold for one another brings us much pain when we are parted by death. Jesus too wept at the grave of his friend. Today we remember. Today we

honor. And today we give thanks to God for the life that was shared, and for the life that in Christ will never, ever end. There will be a time in our service when you may come with a votive candle or two to remember all those who are gone now, but still remain important to who you are. Votives are a symbol of our prayers, and these lights bear witness to all those who have come before us who have made us who we are today. As these candles are placed upon the altar I hope it reminds you of that great river of light and life where are loved ones still stand, waiting for that final homecoming when we shall all be together. I hope and pray that the songs, the readings, and the liturgy bring you much comfort as we acknowledge our shared grief and as we proclaim the gospel — the good news that what God has created, what God has breathed life



into, will never cease and will never fade away. God is love, and those who abide in love will always abide in God. All Saints' is one of the church's oldest liturgies that has been a source of comfort for so many.
